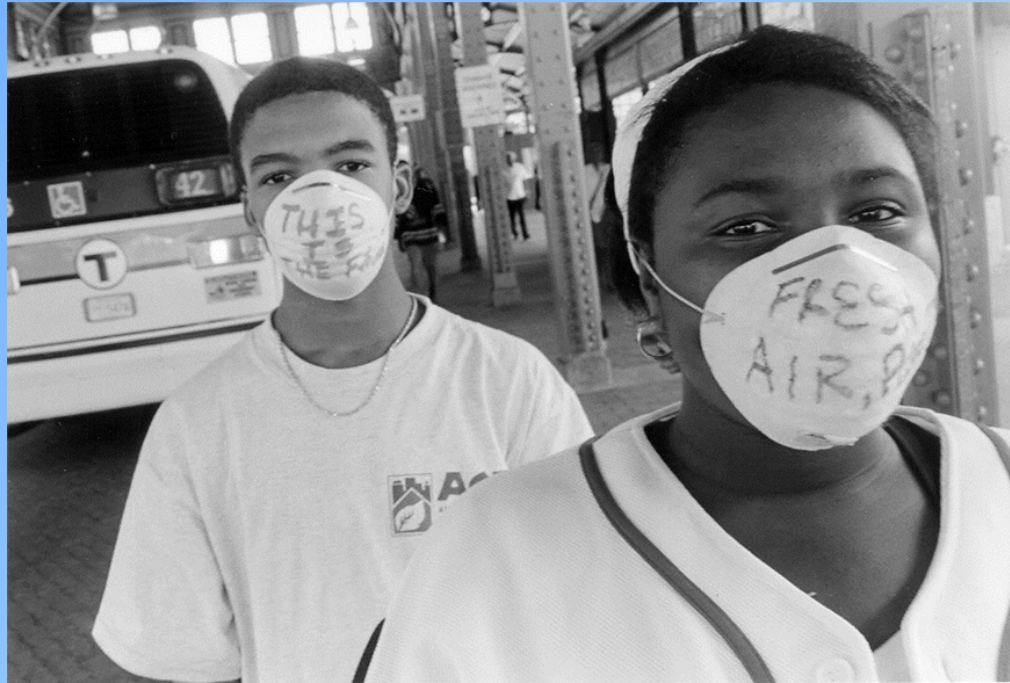

- **What have we learned from past environmental and transportation policy?**
- **What are challenges associated with Cap & Invest?**
- **How do we get the Process and Policy Right?**
 - **Engage directly affected communities to develop solutions**
 - **Understand broad definition of equity and embed throughout program**

Modeling and Setting the Baseline

- **Pair modeling with effective stakeholder engagement**
- **Questions to consider:**
 - **How do communities engage with these models to understand the impact on our communities?**
 - **What are examples where modeling has effectively engaged community?**

Addressing the Climate Crisis

- **Embrace host of solutions to address the climate crisis**
- **Understand and acknowledge policy limitations and unintended consequences**
- **Value expertise and solutions coming from communities directly affected**
- **Invest time on the front end to engage and communicate effectively about solutions**
